You will need to cut the stem from the flower's head and place them in different sized gold bowls, mixed with the autumn leaves. He then suggests scattering the remaining leaves onto the table and placing a few pumpkins here and there to complete the look. This festive yet stylish centerpiece will leave your guests in awe.
