The historic Rialto Theatre in Downtown anchors Tucson's rich arts heritage. Along with the neighboring Hotel Congress, it was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2003.



Opened in 1920, The Rialto Theatre has leveraged its location on the I-10 to lure popular artists as they travel from Texas to California, according to Arizona Public Media. Originally a venue for silent films and Vaudeville shows, the theater has also been home to plays, concerts, and Spanish-language flicks. The Rialto experienced several name changes throughout the 20th-century, including The Paramount and El Cine Plaza. It was purchased by the City of Tucson in 1994, and is now owned by the non-profit organization, Congress Street Historic Theatres Foundation. Notable upcoming shows include:

The band will be in Tucson to promote its latest album, *The Eternal*.
