The REACh (Rodeo Education and Children) program offers kids a fun way to celebrate the history of the rodeo and the American West. Each program, which includes demonstrations with actual rodeo equipment, lasts 45 minutes and is offered on Monday, Feb. 20 and Tuesday, Feb. 21.

Join the more than 200,000 people enjoying The Tucson Rodeo Parade, The World's Longest Non-Motorized Parade, at 9 a.m. on Feb. 23. Watch as western-themed floats, horse-drawn coaches, Mexican folk dancers, marching bands and outfitted riders strut their stuff down the streets of Tucson.
