Murder at the Magic Show: New Year's Eve at Westin La Paloma Resort

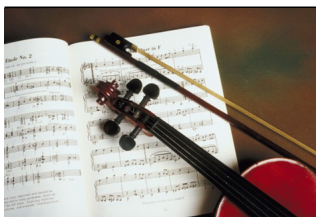
