

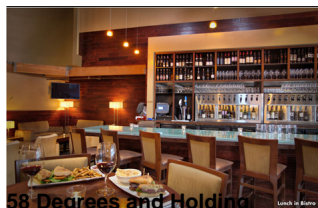
Tucson Wine Bars
