Also, he intends the freed space to become a library and clothing bank to benefit the charter school community.

Projected to be completed before the beginning of the school year in August, the snack bar will raise more money for the school as it will be used to sell snacks during sporting events and after school.

Along with the help of his Scout Troops and volunteers, Miller predicts the project to be completed in only three days. Miller's mother will help to supervise, and Miller planned for professional construction workers to help train volunteers before building. He also has already organized for safety equipment to be available, as well as transportation and pizza and drinks at the work site. He already drafted out a plan and is seeking help from donors and local business owners to help contribute and reach the \$1200 he'll need.
