Friday:



Sunset in the Skyspace at SMoCA

Watch the longest day of the year draw to a close through the perspective of James Turrell's Skyspace Knight Rise at the <u>Scottsdale Museum of Contemporary Art</u>. The elliptical opening of the ceiling in the museum's outdoor courtyard creates the illusion that the sky is descending upon the viewer, while lights shift the sky's natural color. <u>Tickets</u> to the summer solstice celebration cost \$10 and viewing begins at 7:30 p.m.



"Celebrating the Life of Chester Bennington" at monOrchid

Remember the life and career of late Linkin Park singer Chester Bennington at the monOrchid in Downtown Phoenix this Friday from 6:30 to 10 p.m. Local photographer and musician Jim Louvau captured the Phoenix-native rock n' roll artist on and off stage before Bennington's death in 2017, and the result is the photo exhibit "Celebrating the Life of Chester Bennington." Tickets can be purchased online for \$35, and a portion of all proceeds will be donated to 320 Change Direction, a charity dedicated to bringing awareness to mental health.
