
We know our readers can't get enough of the people behind the "@." So here are six Phoenix Suns players and staff that have us glued to Twitter.

Why did you start Tweeting?

I got a lot of 'TMI' replies, of course, but I also got a lot of replies from fellow fathers empathizing with my plight and offering some good advice for my recovery.

What is the strangest place you've Tweeted from?



What is the strangest place you've Tweeted from?


Bathroom.

How do you choose who you follow?


