"Unfortunately, with every crisis there seems to be those among us who invent despicable schemes designed to take advantage of our compassion," says Arizona Secretary of State Ken Bennett in a press release. "During this time, we must remain especially vigilant for these scams to ensure that our hard-earned money gets to the people who desperately need it."



In order to make sure that charitable citizens are donating to reputable organizations and services, Bennett recommends the following steps:

While the information isn't a guarantee that the organization is genuinely advancing their stated cause, it is a great place to begin their research on how their donation will be used and verify the charity's authenticity."
