Ultimately, Bagan and his panel decide the winner of the challenge. Bagan set two amateur teams up overnight in the frightening Jerome Grand Hotel overlooking the town of Jerome. The recent episode aired on September 16th.

Do you think you have what it takes? The Jerome Grand Hotel hosts ghost-hunting tours on selected nights. Ghost hunts are open to hotel guests and the Jerome Grand Hotel provides guests with a tour guide, EMF meter, IR thermometer and digital camera to document any paranormal activity. The price of the haunted tour \$20 per person. Famous sightings include a distraught mother who died during child labor, and a nurse who continues to roam the abandon hallways.
