Their partners that heal, a W.O.N.D.E.R. Project where artists visit children and adults in the hospital to entertain them and ease the tension they might feel. The theatre also offers a Theatre for Young Audiences where children are able to see a live performance and are offered an introduction to culture that will hopefully impact their lives irrevocably.
