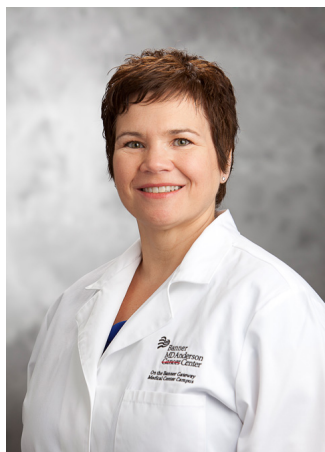

This program is administered by the American College of Surgeons and the accreditation is for three years.
