#### CityScape

Little ones may get antsy sitting through nine innings of a Diamondback's game at Chase Field, but they definitely won't at the nearby splash pad at CityScape in Downtown Phoenix. After a day of shopping, dining or exploring a museum, this urban oasis is the perfect place for the kiddos to cool off this summer. The CityScape splash pad is open daily from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. and is accessible via light rail. Or there is free two-hour parking with validation. ### **Eastmark**
