John C. Lincoln Earns Magnet Status for Third Time

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Congrats to John C. "This is a very prestigious honor that is now based on measurable outcomes – successful hospitals have to demonstrate quality patient care, excellent leadership, nurse satisfaction, patient satisfaction and professional research that adds to the library of evidence-based care," says Maggie Griffin, RN, MS, vice president and chief nursing officer at the North Mountain hospital. "Earning Magnet designation is more difficult every time around, and it should be! This Magnet recognition is especially meaningful."
