Not familiar with James Marshall and his fantastic work, well his artwork merged the worlds of street art, Japanese pop culture and the raw energy of the punk scene. He was formally trained at the Art Institute of Chicago and apprenticed with the influential Japanese artist, Takashi Murakami. Marshall's early career centered on artwork that merged the worlds of street art and cartoons, leading him to his iconic character "Space Monkey" of a catatonic mouse which reflects his vision of a person. SPA says, "James Marshall is now known for his colorful geometric abstract works, often associated with skateboard and graffiti subcultures". Over time his work has evolved, highlighting bright and vivid color palettes, complex layering of colors, crisp lines, and busy geometric patterns. Also he has continued to create murals around the world and in area of surf, skate and music gear working with a variety of major companies such as Hurley.
