Check out the Scottsdale Waterfront currently featuring Scottsdale Public Art's latest temporary art installation Jellies in the Sky, Cacti in the Water created by Shana Koenig, creating a large scale temporary installation of glowing, color-changing fiber optic sculptures on view through the winter 2015. Also stop by the Livery space for Looking For Tsosido a video installation created by local artist Steven J. Yazzie as part of his Museum of Walking creative residency with Angela Ellsworth. This is a special one-night only event tonight from 7pm until 9pm where viewers will have the opportunity to get a sneak peak at this film and meet the artist. Looking For Tsosido (2013) explores the polymorphous mythologies of self through the process of hiking a Navajo Sacred Mountain, Sis' najinni (Blanca Peak), Colorado.
