This past spring when Marshall was commissioned to create the gorgeous mural Radiate in the SMoCA Lounge the artist had mentioned that the space should be activated with fun games and movies perfect for entire community and fun for all ages. SMoCA has worked with the artist, artist James Marshall (a.k.a Dalek) to activate the space to include games, activities and oh did we mention pink Astro Turf creating James Marshall's Winter Break. Visitors can try their hand at putt-putt, beanbag toss, and even dominoes, while they watch iconic scenes from some of the 1980s most beloved films.

Opening on January 31st is southwestNET: Postcommodity an engaging exhibition that will present two monumental installations: *Promoting a More Just, Verdant and Harmonious Resolution* (2011) and *Pollination* (2015). <u>Postcommodity</u> is a transdisciplinary American Indian arts collective comprising of Raven Chacon, Cristóbal Martínez, Kade L. Twist and Nathan Young. This collective questions common national narratives and the commodification of nature, history and culture. This exhibition was organized by the Scottsdale Museum of Contemporary Art and sponsored by Botanicare and Tamar Weiss in memory of Emil Weiss. This exhibition will be on view until April 26th.
