

Scottsdale Public Art Presents the 10th Annual Cycle the Arts

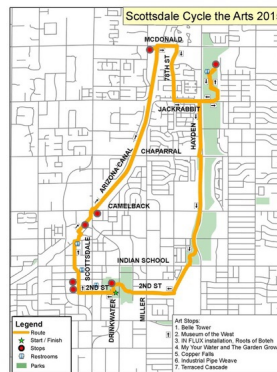
