The MIM focus is on five major global regions: Africa and the Middle East, Asia and Oceania, Europe, Latin America and the Caribbean, and the United States and Canada in their Geographic Galleries. Most displays feature amazing state-of-the-art audio and video, giving visitors the ability to see, hear and observe the instrument, in their proper context. The Artist Gallery showcases music icons ranging from Elvis Presley to Taylor Swift, including their instruments, costumes, and video footage of them performing on stage. Also explore and play in the Experience Gallery where all guests can play a variety of instruments from around the world.



Don't miss seeing there latest traveling exhibition "Beyond the Beat: Drums Of The World" which is on display now until October 11th, 2015. Focusing on the importance of drums and how the enduring importance they have had within human life including more than one hundred drums from forty-five countries.
