Head to downtown Phoenix for First Friday, November 6th which promises to be a great night of art, food and entertainment!

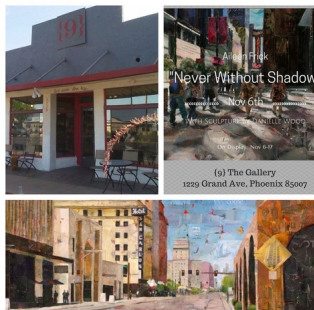
