Photographs were important tools for the artist utilizing them in her artwork as well as a strong family connection to photography, as both her grandfather and father were professional photographers.



This exhibition is displayed on six areas of importance "Frida's Loves and Photography", "The Origins," "Her Broken Body", "Politics," "Revolutions and Diego" and "The Blue House". Highlights of the exhibition include many stunning portraits of the artist at work including the 1951 "Frida painting the portrait of her father by Gisèle Fruend". "Frida Kahlo by Lola Álvarez Bravo" is an iconic image captured in 1944 of the artist at her home with one of her dogs. The exhibition also features wonderful activity stations "Las Favoritas de Frida" inviting patrons to write a letter to the artist or even construct their very your own taco, which helps to make the exhibition accessible for all ages.
