
Kevin Caron Shares his Sculpture with the Community

Caron's ability and skilled hand allows him to work with an innate grasp of space, proportion and physics, when sculpting. He is visually aware of his work, as well as their sound and texture creating unique and striking steel sculptures that range in scale and color. When asked about the inspiration behind these incredible sculptures Caron said that it was "inspired by his interest in astronomy and geometric forms." Caron further said "in my work I seek out illusion in contour and its capacity, treating unusual intersections as purposeful composition."



Utilizing new digital tools to create beautiful 3-D printed sculptures, which continue to garner him tremendous buzz within the art community. "The intersection between tools and my work, have led to my pioneering work with 3D printing, designs his work and printing it himself on a unique 8-foot-tall 3D printer", which visitors can experience first hand this weekend at his studio.
