

Hahn conducted a video interview on the road with the Diamondbacks during the World Series to talk about his journey after a spinal cord injury while playing for ASU Baseball and how he used the Sports & Fitness Center to rehabilitate and gain strength physically and mentally. Hurley shared his story about surviving a car accident nearly 30 years ago with Valley sports leader and Founder/CEO of <a href="Sports360AZ.com">Sports360AZ.com</a> Brad Cesmat.

This year, the breakfast honored Mike McQuaid, a longtime community philanthropist who passed away in 2020. McQuaid and his business partner, Jim Whitehead, were instrumental in helping to start the 360Breakfast in 2018.
