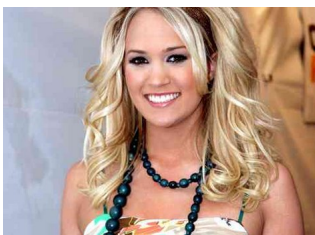
Jonas Brothers with Demi Lovato and Camp Rock Friends
