TIME produces the best photographs and TIME is what allows everyone to take a slow breath in and out and enjoy the day while taking photos. YOU are the most important piece of the day and you deserve to take time for images you'll have forever.

Investing in the photographer and videographer that you love, building trust with your vendors, and creating a stress free timeline will hopefully create a smooth wedding day for you AND your guests.
