

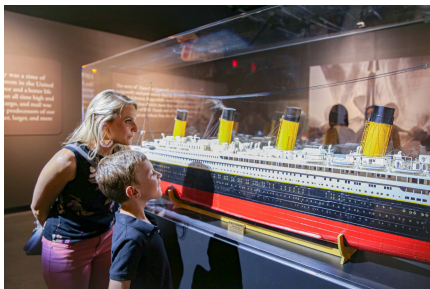

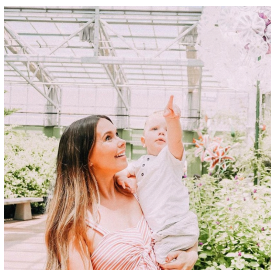
Phoenix Center for the Arts Open House
