Renowned artists from across the globe will make North Scottsdale home for 10 weeks as they create original pieces of fine art at the [Arizona Fine Art EXPO](#). Through Sunday, March 26 from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily on the southwest corner of Scottsdale and Jomax Roads, next to MacDonald's Ranch, patrons can stroll throughout a two-acre sculpture garden, which includes a Koi pond with waterfall and hummingbird garden surrounded by natural desert. Other highlights include a café, wine tastings, garden parties, book signings, Arabian horse quick-draw event, live music every weekend and more. And, of course, visit 110 studios to meet the artists and see them in action. Season passes are \$10; season passes for seniors and military are \$8; and children under 12 are free. Parking is free.

Sunday A'Fair: Free Concerts In The Park
