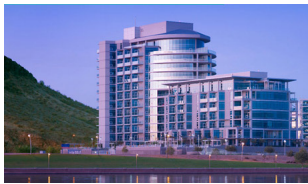


New Bridgeview Condos Tower Tempe Town Lake
