Founded back in 1996 by Lowery, a Valley resident, NLYF primary purpose is to provide assistance to the youth, especially Native Americans, "by developing, promoting and sponsoring programs and relationships that foster self-esteem, leadership qualities and skills, and encourage youth to be positive assets to their communities." The foundation sponsors many programs to help the youth reach their leadership potential while featuring important cultural components.

All proceeds from "Imagine 100 Faces VIP Night" will directly go toward the Nick Lowery Youth Foundation and its programs. Tickets start at \$100 for food and drink, live and silent auctions, live entertainment, an autograph session and more.
