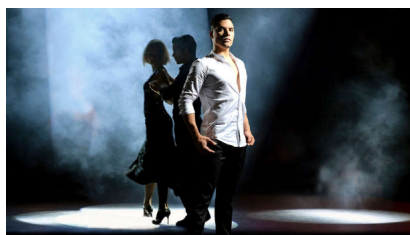

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[Wet Electric Music Festival at Big Surf Water Park](#)

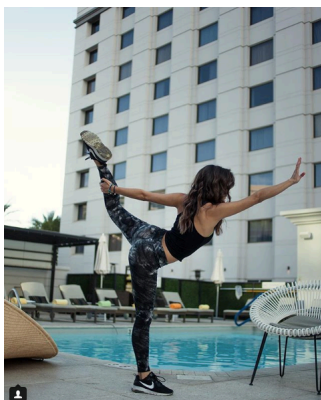
