The Cinderella Affair gives high school juniors and seniors the opportunity to select a prom dress at no cost. The fairy godmother-like program is hosted through a partnership between the EVWL and the Tempe Community Council.

It also provides dresses for exchange students from the Tempe Sister Cities program.
